#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

This was my first year at Colonial High School and my first Spring Musical production working without an educator team. If I were being pretentious, I'd say I did an amazing job and that my leadership made all the difference. But here's the truth: I couldn't have done this alone. I would've lost my mind a long time ago. There's only so much one person can do—and I have never been more grateful for the support of others in completing a large-scale project like this.

Before the Spring Musical was even a thought, students flooded my room daily: someone swearing they could "pop and lock," another bursting into a monologue from Hamlet, and at least seventeen souls riffing something from Wicked. (So much Wicked. So much Cynthia Erivo energy. Please, Lord—save me from Defying Gravity.) Then there was this one strange musical I'd only heard about in bits and pieces—it kept popping up on TikTok. A headless soprano floating through space, a boy in a black dress belting, a hip-hop number, a mystical fortune teller, and an existential deep-dive into the worth of a life. It felt chaotic. It felt weird. And it felt right.

So we jumped in. Full force. No looking back.

And let me tell you—these students blew me away. Within them, they hold multitudes:

Set designers. Engineers. Carpenters. Sound designers. Food magicians (the McDonald's disappears without a trace). Audio techs. Stage managers. Lighting designers. Costume creators. Teachers.

Musical directors. Singers. Dancers. Actors. Problem-solvers. Improvisers. Marketers. Producers. Prop masters. Fog and haze technicians. Painters. Sculptors. Innovators. Collaborators. Leaders. And most importantly—silly geese.

I am endlessly proud. Thank you, Colonial HS Theatre and Thespian Troupe 592. You remind me why theatre matters.

And thank you to all the families and those who care for our students, dedicating their time, energy and effort to help their student performers succeed. It is not always easy, but it's worth it to see your students soar!


