

## DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When I began teaching at MCS ten years ago, I knew that I belonged here. I knew this would be the place that would challenge me to grow in my career and passions. In my life, I have been guided by the phrase, "You are one decision away from changing your life." By the end of my first year, I made two. I began working with the Caponi's Cannolis School of the Arts and started a small after school theatre program. The Caponi's helped learn more about the industry, producing and directing shows. I am forever grateful to them for taking a chance on me.

The MCS program was the third time in my career that I instituted this type of enrichment opportunity at a school. I truly believe that the performing and visual arts are vital at all age levels. Our first show was The Princess and the Pea. It was the second time I had produced and directed it and I was eager to show our school community that the kids at MCS needed this program. We started that year with sixteen fourth and fifth graders, three mic stands, a tiny six channel board, four flats and fluorescent lighting. With the help of my good friend Vanessa McDermott, the support of Ms Watts and Ms Dison, and 16 eager actors, we embarked on a journey to create something that has developed an esteemed reputation.

Once our middle school was built, I knew it was one of those moments to make a decision. I applied to be MCS's middle school theatre teacher. Again, I was granted the opportunity to change my life. That year, I began working with the phenomenal Erin Sundin and the accomplished Tiana Sandh. Together we built what you see today. Within the first year, we began being called "the trio". In the performing arts world, being a triple threat is considered highly desirable. Over the years, we bonded and became a force to be reckoned with. The success and reputation of our program hung on the balance of that partnership. The story of our work is extraordinary and over time, through the support of our school's administration, parents, colleagues, staff, and each and every cherished student, we now have 14 mics, a 32 channel mixer, professional lighting and a throng of talented technicians and actors. This theatre program has grown and flourished and I know it will continue to do so when we are gone.

School of Rock is a show I would have only dreamed of directing and producing ten years ago. Today, the talent and ability of these middle school students enables us the opportunity to showcase Andrew Lloyd Webber's amazing work. He is an icon in the musical theatre industry and a genius in his own right. This particular musical has an incredible message about following your passion and to "strive for a life of fullness, not just achievement". So many of the character's in this production have a personal journey that encompasses this idea. It encapsulates the saying, "Do what you love and you will never work a day in your life". Sometimes following your dreams requires you to endure some struggle, move away from everything you know and start anew. I hope this show inspires you to take a chance. Dare to fail. Dare to be different. Make that one decision that will change your life forever.

What an amazing opportunity to do a show about passion for music! It has been my pleasure to work with the students on a show that means a lot to me. The message of finding your talent, honing your skill, and believing in yourself is the best message we could ever instill in our students.
